Tips, Tricks, & Techniques

Linda Hall suggested we begin an advice column wherein members may submit art related questions and in turn, we will seek answers from other members. Think, "Dear Abby" but in this case, we're all Abby. So email your questions to fwagnewsletters@gmail.com and I will post them in the newsletter, and await a response from you, then post the answer the next month.

As an example, here's the first question, already asked and answered. I was interested in making giclée prints of one of my paintings but imagined it to be a complex process. Linda Galloway, having crossed that bridge already, suggested using ARC Document Solutions on Fernhill Ave. They made it easy, offering a wide range of printing surfaces. I opted for the heavy watercolor paper but Linda prefers a canvas type surface. To protect the canvas from water damage, it was suggested to glaze the print with Minwax Polycrylic Protective Finish. I was able to get plastic sleeves and fitted foam board backing from Creative Framing.

The Fort Wayne Artists Guild is committed to enhancing knowledge about the fine arts and to providing the opportunity for artistic growth. We are members of Arts United and Indiana Federation of Art.

Judge: "Capturing the mood of the moment and the effect of light is an important goal in my work." - Carolyn E. Lewis

A commendable quality of Lewis' work is the feeling one experiences of actually being in the scene while viewing her strongly designed landscapes. Lewis continues, "...but most of all, I enjoy the process of creating art and communicating the atmosphere and drama of my subject."

The art of Carolyn Lewis is inspired by nature, wildlife, and people. It is sensitive without being overly sentimental. Her commissioned portraits of individuals and animals, and her powerful landscapes, are steadily gaining acclaim in national and international art circles.

Her awards and honors are many. She has taught classes and workshops for 30 years in the US and abroad.

Eligibility: Artists must be 18 years or older. Each entry must be an unassisted original work by the artist, not previously exhibited in the Ventures Show and completed within the last three years. Copies of other artists' work or published photographs, computer generated art, photography, installment art, or giclees are not acceptable. Artwork must not depict images of violence, sexual conduct or the degradation of race, creed or religion.

Category: Open to all framed or gallery wrapped work. Artists shall classify each entry on the Entry Form and Identification Label according to the following Categories:

Oil/Acrylic: Oil or acrylic paintings on canvas, artist board, wood panel or masonite. Water Media: Watercolor, gouache or acrylic on paper, Yupo, or watercolor board. Dry Media: Pastel, charcoal, graphite, colored pencil, marker, ink, fabric, and printmaking on paper substrate.

Three-Dimensional Art: Sculpture, sculptural relief, ceramics, art pottery and jewelry.

Artists entering mixed media shall classify each entry in one category on the basis of predominant medium or dimensions of the work.

Size Limitation: Hanging art can be no larger than 40" in either direction, including frame. All 2-D work must be dry and ready to hang. No saw tooth hangers. Dimensions of sculptures may not exceed 18"w x 18"d x 24"h. No artwork can weigh more than 50 pounds.

Entry Fee: \$35 FWAG members/\$45 non-members entitles the artist to submit three entries. \$10 member/\$15 non-member for an additional entry. Limit, four total. USF students - \$20 for three or \$10 for one entry. Checks payable to Fort Wayne Artists Guild. Entrance fee is not refundable.

Entry procedure: Complete entry form. Entry form with check must be sent and postmarked by Friday, June 9, 2017, to Thomas Nuss, 8105 Legacy Lane, Fort Wayne IN 46835. Entries postmarked after June 9 or on-site entry will be \$10 extra per artist.

Delivery: Deliver works, with identification labels attached, to the Mimi and Ian Rolland Art and Visual Communication Center, University of Saint Francis, Fort Wayne. (Entrance is off Leesburg Road on the east side of university campus.) Delivery dates are Saturday, June 24, 9am-2pm, and Monday, June 26, 10am-2 pm. Drop off area will be clearly marked.

Notification of Acceptance: Notification of accepted work will be by e-mail after 5pm Friday, June 30. Phone notification will be provided for artists without e-mail.

Return of Entries: Artwork not accepted may be picked up on Saturday, July 1, 9am-2pm, or Monday, July 3, 10am-2pm. A charge of \$5 a day will be assessed for artwork not picked up on time. There are no exceptions.

Awards and Sales: One entry shall receive a Best of Show award. All media are eligible for this award. First, Second and Third place awards shall be given for each Category. In addition to the Category awards, all work will be eligible for Memorial Awards and Merit Awards. These awards include genre and/or style. Merit Awards will honor achievement in Portraiture, Abstract Art, Landscape, and Still Life. Over \$2,000 in prizes will be awarded. Works may be priced for sale or marked NFS. A 35% commission will be retained on the sales. Pieces sold in the show cannot be picked up until the show closes.

Reception: A public reception for the artists will be held at the Weatherhead Gallery in the Mimi and Ian Rolland Art and Visual Communication Center on Saturday, July 8, 2017, 6-8pm.

Awards will be presented at 7:00 pm.

Pick up: Artwork is released and may be picked up Saturday, August 19, 10am-2pm, or Monday, August 21, 10am-2pm.
